#### **About KIFAD:**

Kiyita Family Alliance for Development (KIFAD) is a registered indigenous / local Non Governmental Organization, established in 2001, registration No- S. 5914 / 5184) which is community based with its Headquarters at Bulabakulu village, Banda parish, Mende Sub county, Wakiso District, Uganda.

We concentrate mainly on increasing care and support to people infected and affected by HIV / AIDS in order to mitigate the effects of the epidemic. Furthermore, we aim at strengthening the coping of Orphans Vulnerable Children (OVC) and People Living with HIV/AIDS (PLWHA) families to progressively become self reliant for economical sustainability of their families, building the internal capacity of KIFAD for effective and sustainable programme design and implementation and finally, improving access to food among families / households, infected and affected by HIV / AIDS, as far as our financial means allows us to.

#### **The Role:**

Do you want to help build a better future for children 3 – 8 years of age by giving them valuable English skills? Are you looking to discover an exciting country while also providing a real positive benefit in the lives of its people?

In Uganda, access to English education is sadly lacking for those from poor economic backgrounds. While children from wealthy families can get an excellent English education in a private school, these disadvantaged kids can not afford this privilege and as such lag behind when it comes to career opportunities later in life.

Sadly, almost a fifth of the population still lives in poverty, and lack of proper access to education is the primary cause of this lingering problem, as a quarter of the population still lacks literacy.

English has become an increasingly vital skill, and public schools are solely lacking in resources and manpower to keep up with this demand. Therefore, those without the resources to send their children to expensive private schools are unable to ensure their children can compete for jobs in the future.

For this reason, volunteers are solely needed to teach English in Uganda and provide less fortunate children with the chance for a prosperous and bright future. As a volunteer traveling to teach English in Uganda you will teach English to children 3 – 8 years of age, to improve their English, share your passion and bring a change in the life of these underprivileged children.

With the socioeconomic growth and development of Uganda, the demand for English skills has grown exponentially, and when you join KIFAD as an English Teacher, you



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will teach English at KIFAD Integrated Early Childhood Development Centre to ensure every child has a chance to learn, speak and express themselves in English.

This role is an excellent opportunity to gain real professional experience in international development and see how communities and NGOs are tackling the Education issues in Uganda. There are many opportunities to meet with other NGOs and community organisations and to contribute to supporting people and communities affected by HIV/AIDS.

### **Skills and Qualifications:**

No specific qualifications are needed.

You should have a great love and passion for children, and a genuine desire to help make a better world by teaching them vital English skills. You should be enthusiastic, kind and patient, and respectful of local culture and customs. While we welcome people regardless of education and experience, being a native English speaker or possessing previous teaching experience is an added advantage.

### **Responsibilities & Impact:**

As a volunteer English-teacher, you will be teaching English and imparting valuable English language skills to underprivileged children. Depending on your skill, you will be teaching independently or as an assistant to local Early Childhood Development (ECD) Instructor. In addition to teaching English, you can help children by organizing games or any extracurricular activities such as Music, Dance and Drama (MDD).

When you work as English teacher you will make a difference in the life of children, and your work will be critical in ensuring that these children have a successful adulthood, as English skills are solely needed to compete in the job market in Uganda. The valuable skills you help them learn will ensure that the educational and wealth gap shrinks, as the children use these skills to lift themselves out of poverty at a later stage in their lifetime.

Many Ugandan people face hardships and struggle to learn English due to poverty. So, by volunteering in the Teaching English Uganda project you'll be making English easily accessible to underprivileged kids and help them improve their English, which will greatly help them in the future.

By taking part in our English Teaching volunteer program, you will get a feel of a global classroom experience. This is a challenging as well as a rewarding opportunity for you and a good learning curve that teaches you to handle pressures and problems giving you a once in a lifetime experience.
